For the last several years we have been offering some of our best new hostas as liners. This is the third year of our new production system and hopefully the third year is the charm. We will send you several availability lists of our Classic Hosta Liners™ this year with different delivery times. **The hostas on this June Availability are still in production and will be ready to be shipped in June as quantities become available.** Please order early to avoid disappointment as some quantities are limited.

The wholesale hosta market has seen the price for hosta liners fall to extreme lows in the past decade. While this has been good for the consumer, it has also resulted in the demise of two cutting edge liner producers of new hosta cultivars. I think many in our business have forgotten that hostas have value and that they are not inexpensive to produce. Our liner prices are generally one half or less than our bare root plants which in turn are less than half of their retail price. For Example: The very popular ‘Blueberry Waffles’ is a \$4.00 liner, a \$10.00 bare root plant for a hosta that averages \$20-25.00 retail. Yes, **we do offer quantity discounts on all our hosta offerings**, just ask and we will be glad to work with you as best we can. We want this to be profitable for us all.

Classic Hosta Liners™ in 96 plug trays and the minimum order is only 12 per cultivar with a total minimum liner order of 48 plants.

- ‘1st and Ten’ Very large. Tall mound of blue green shovel shaped leaves that are somewhat ruffled and puckered, makes an impressive clump. \$4.00 each
- ‘Abundant Love’ Large. Large rounded blue-green leaves that are heavily puckered but also folded and twisted make this hosta dance. Nice flowers just above the foliage. \$5.00
- * ‘Ambrosia’^{PPAF} Large. Large very frosty blue heart-shaped leaves with a light yellow center make this ‘Guacamole’ sport unique. Fragrant flowers too. \$7.50
- * ‘Andy Murray’ Medium to large. A unique yellow-margined blue hosta from my “Longiana” line. Named for the tennis star. Now available in the US. \$10.00
- ‘Aphrodite’ Large. Doubled-flowered form of *H. plantaginea*. Light green, shiny, sun tolerant foliage and large double white flowers that are very fragrant. \$3.75

- ‘Appletini’ Small. Very shiny apple green heart-shaped leaves form a tight mound. Great color and grows well. \$3.75
- *‘Baby Blue Eyes’ Small. Tight flat mound of blue heart-shaped leaves that have very good substance. Very cute. \$3.75
- ‘Baby Booties’ Mini. Bright white-margined mini with green heart-shaped leaves, rapidly makes a cute little clump. \$4.00
- *‘Beet Salad’ Medium. Attractive, rapidly growing mound of light green leaves with thin red margins! Bright red scapes with attractive dark lavender flowers. \$5.00
- ‘Blue Mouse Ears’ Mini. Classic round blue-leafed “mouse”, makes a tight mound. Still very popular as a container plant. \$2.00
- *‘Blue Perfection’ Large. Very waxy light blue leaves. A fast growing, sun tolerant, blue ‘Ambrosia’^{PPAF} sport with fragrant flowers. \$4.00
- ‘Blueberry Waffles’ Very large. Perfect mound of deep blue rounded leaves that are intensely puckered. Nice near white flowers. Rapidly becoming a classic. \$4.00
- ‘Cookie Crumbs’ Mini. This white-margined sport of ‘Tiny Tears’ makes the perfect true miniature clump. Vigorous enough to flourish in the garden. \$5.00
- *‘Cracker Crumbs’ Mini. Bright honey-yellow leaves painted with a dark green margin. Makes a tight flat mound, perfect in a pot or in the garden. \$3.75
- *‘Doubled Up’ Large. Tetraploid form of *H. plantaginea* found at our nursery. Flowers are larger than species and the clump is more compact with great substance. \$4.00
- ‘Evening Blush’ Medium. Great new blue with wavy pointed leaves, purple petioles, and fantastic purple flowers that swirl around the scape. \$5.00
- ‘Fashionista’ Small-medium. Bright yellow leaves with pure white margins and reddish purple petioles. Sport of ‘Designer Genes’. \$4.50
- *‘First Blush’^{PPAF} Medium. Green leaves with red petioles and red margins, then entire leaf blushes purplish red. Our first red-leafed hosta is a true breakthrough!

- *‘Frost Giant’ Very large. Upright stately clump of large pointed blue leaves with bright yellow margins. A very sturdy hosta destined for greatness. \$4.50
- ‘Frosted Mouse Ears’ Mini. Classic white-margined form of ‘Blue Mouse Ears’ becomes brighter as the summer progresses. \$4.00
- ‘Frosty Morn’ Small-medium. Bright yellow rounded leaves covered with lots of frosty white wax. Good substance, an oldie but goodie. \$4.00
- ‘Fruit Cup’ Mini. Interesting new green cupped and puckered very round leaves that make a flat, tight clump. Very different and popular last year. \$7.50
- ‘Gemstone’ Small. Small blue heart-shaped leaves that form a very tight mound. Good color and rapid growth. \$3.50

- ‘Her Eyes Were Blue’ Medium. Very blue pointed leaves that are nicely ruffled and puckered. Limited. \$4.50
- ‘Holy Mouse Ears’ Mini. Classic white-centered sport of ‘Blue Mouse Ears’ becomes brighter as the summer progresses. \$4.00
- *‘Honey Bear’ Large. New rapidly growing sun tolerant hosta with dark green puckered leaves and a bright gold margin. Great color contrast and fragrant flowers too. \$7.50
- ‘Hovercraft’ Medium. Very blue almost perfectly round leaves hover above a spreading clump. Attractive even as a small plant. \$4.50
- ‘Imperial Palace’ Medium-large. Heart-shaped leaves have a yellow to cream center, and a wide green margin. Grows easily into an impressive clump. \$4.50
- *‘Infatuation’ Medium. This upright fountaining hosta has very waxy long pointed blue leaves with cranberry-colored petioles. *H. kikutii* heritage. \$4.50
- ‘Itsy Bitsy Spider’ Mini. This very small very narrow leafed blue-green hosta makes a very flat mat of wolf spider foliage. The perfect unique trough hosta. \$4.50
- ‘Jetstream’ Medium. Unique combination of blue foliage that is very frosty blue in the spring and very shiny blue in the summer. A fast grower. \$4.50
- ‘Lemon Love Note’ Mini. Cute yellow ruffled and twisted leaves that make a dense mound. An eye catcher in the spring. \$3.50
- ‘Lemontini’ Small. Almost perfect heart-shaped leaves emerge bright yellow and become chartreuse. Unbeatable in early spring. \$3.75
- *‘Mango Salsa’ Medium. A shining beacon in the spring of yellow wavy leaves with deep red petioles and scapes. Sun tolerant. One of our best. \$5.00
- ‘Megan’s Angel’ Huge. Beautiful ‘Blue Angel’ sport with wide yellow margins that will bleach to white in sun. Very impressive in the landscape. \$4.50
- ‘Miracle Lemony’ Small to medium. This wavy-leafed green hosta of *H. tsushimensis* parentage is the first yellow flowered hosta to be introduced. Very cool! \$7.50
- *‘Nate the Great’ Very large. Very upright large blue-green leaves and tall straight scapes make a very vertical presentation in the garden. Named for my great Nate. \$4.50
- *‘Orange Marmalade’^{PP#16,742} Medium. Blue leaves with a leaf center that lightens as the season progresses from yellow to orange, yes orange, to near white. \$4.50
- ‘Pebble Creek’ Large. Heavily puckered large gold leaves that become brighter as the season progresses. Makes a perfectly rounded clump. \$4.50
- ‘Picasso’ Small. Beautiful blue narrow leaves with a yellow margin make this hosta perfect for a container with other minis. Sport of Sayory’s ‘Indigo’. \$7.50
- ‘Pie a la Mode’ Medium-large. Almost perfect heart-shaped green leaves with interesting wide yellow margins that become white in late summer. \$4.50

- ‘Poseidon’ Large. Drop dead pure white-margined sport of a doubled flowered *H. plantaginea*. The flowers are great but the foliage steals the show. \$6.00
- SILVER STAR**™ Medium. Very upright green leaves with pure white margins accentuated by straight scapes with purple flowers. Very vertical. \$4.00
- ‘Sourpuss’ Very large. This exciting new hosta with its large round yellow leaves with dark green leaf centers seem to undulate in every direction. An impressive clump! \$7.50
- *‘Sugar Plum’ Medium. Upright medium green leaves with deep purple petioles up into the leaf. White leaf backs are held up for you to see!!! Great in a container. \$4.50
- ‘Tidewater’ Medium-large. A flowing clump of blue long-pointed arching leaves with well-defined venation. A favorite of mine. \$4.00
- *‘Tiny Bubbles’ Mini. Feathery bright gold undulating narrow leaves form a rapidly growing fountaining clump. Flowers are closed to add extra interest. \$4.00
- ‘Titanium’ Medium. Silvery blue leaves are heavily rippled with lots of white wax above and below. Holds its color well into summer. Different. \$4.50
- ‘Urchin’ Small. Upright narrow, very wavy dark green leaves that appear spiny. Dark scapes add color contrast in mid-summer. I do like this one. \$3.50
- ‘Viking Ship’ Very large. Upright clump of large rounded oval blue-green leaves with a nice tight ruffle on the margins. Clump has an appealing open look. \$5.00
- ‘Wonderful’ Mini. Very flat teardrop shaped yellow leaves form a very cute symmetric miniature mound. Grows well for a tiny hosta, has proportional blooms. \$3.75
- ‘World Cup’ Large. Very upright gold round leaves that are extremely cupped and held horizontally. AHGA Hosta of the Year in 2018. A must have hosta! \$4.50 ask for quantity discounts!!!
